The Utah Board of Higher Education selected Taylor R. Randall, Ph.D., as the 17th president of the University of Utah today, following an extensive national search.

Randall will assume the role on Monday, Aug. 9,

2021. He succeeds Ruth V. Watkins, who served as president from January 2018-January 2021.

Getting ready for fall. . .what are the

expectations?

We are here for students!

Student Affairs is here for students. As we welcome a record number of students to our campus this fall, (and in many ways have two entering classes--first year students and students who were fully remote during their first year), as well as more students who will live on campus, it is important that our offices are open and welcoming. Student Affairs offices are critical to student success and staff must be present. While some campus functions that are not student facing will move to remote to ease traffic during the first three weeks, this is not allowable for Student Affairs.

What about vaccinations and masks?

Being vaccinated is the best way to protect yourself and others from COVID-19. The CDC has recommended that masks be worn indoors and as affirmed by our senior leaders, the University of Utah is a mask friendly campus (Message from Interim <u>President Good</u>). Legislation has been passed that we cannot require masking nor can we "provide a different educational experience or service based on vaccination status." (See <u>Utah Code 53B-2-112</u>) While we can encourage and answer questions about where and how to get vaccinated, asking questions about vaccination for how we deliver services is not allowed.

What about testing?

Asymptomatic testing at no cost to employees and their dependents and is available in both the Union and Officers' Club. You may learn more and sign up here.

This is a different year for all of us. . .including our students. As we learn how to live with COVID-19 in our midst, let's not lose focus on why we are here. Our students are starting or continuing a very important chapter in their lives and our vision is to "help students find their passion, people and purpose."


