National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) launches soon!

The National Survey of Student Engagement is a standardized, national survey administered every two years to all first-year and senior students during



the spring semester of even years. The data collected from this survey allows for

benchmarking with selected peer groups, with the ability to generate further comparison reports for sub-populations. It includes questions about student engagement inside and outside of the classroom with peers, faculty and staff, as well as questions about high-impact practices. Respondents are eligible to enter a drawing for gift cards.

The survey is set to launch on Monday, March 14.
