

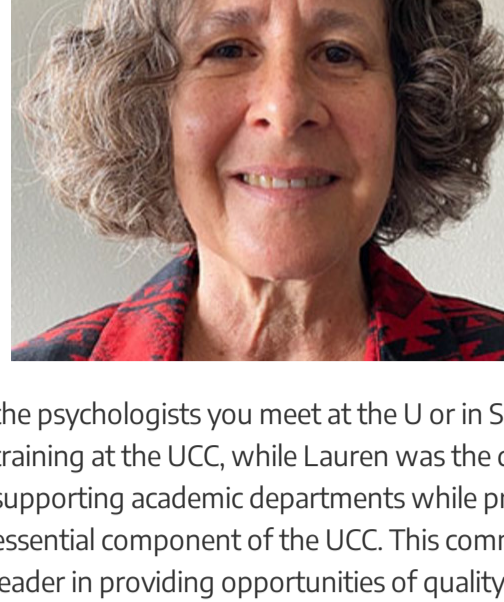

Lauren Weitzman begins phased retirement

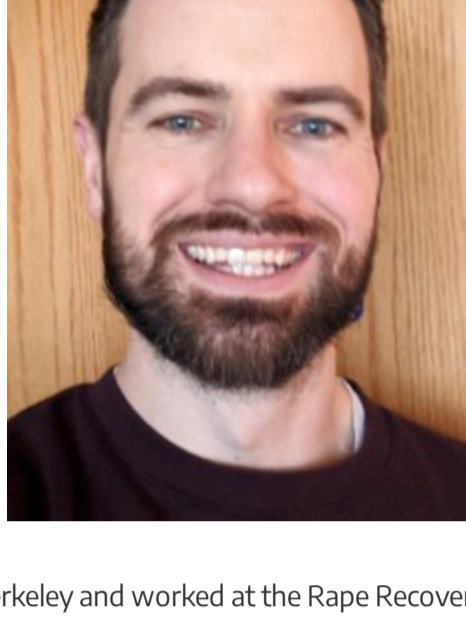
Dr. Lauren Weitzman marks her 25th year at the University of Utah this year. She began at the U as a psychologist and worked her way up to director of the University Counseling Center (UCC). She has one of the longest tenures—18 years—as a director of a counseling center across the nation. In addition, nearly all

the psychologists you meet at the U or in Salt Lake City will have had some of their training at the UCC, while Lauren was the director. Lauren was committed to supporting academic departments while prioritizing training programs that are an essential component of the UCC. This commitment has led to the U being known as a leader in providing opportunities of quality training for licensing for psychologists and social workers.

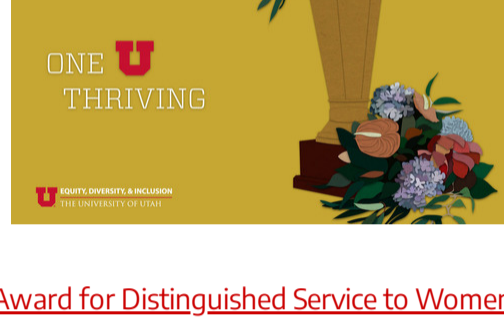
Lauren will be moving to phased retirement this summer. During that time, she will no longer be a part of the UCC, and instead will be working with campus-wide initiatives and projects for Student Affairs. Interim Director for the University Counseling Center

Josh Newbury, LCSW, has been selected as the interim director for the University Counseling Center (UCC) and assumes the position on April 1. Josh has been a UCC clinical social worker since 2015, and he has held several clinical and training leadership positions during his seven years at the UCC. Josh served as the interim director for the Center for Student Wellness, coordinator of the Mindfulness Center, and coordinator of Social Work Training. He also worked as an adjunct professor in the College of Social Work at the U, was a Post-MSW Social Work Fellow at the University of California-Berkeley and worked at the Rape Recovery Center.



Most recently, Josh was the interim associate director for Clinical Services, where he had oversight for all UCC clinical services and has served on the Behavioral Intervention Team (BIT) and other campus committees. Josh’s clinical expertise, commitment to collaborative campus partnerships and dedication to student success provide a critical foundation for this UCC leadership position. Champions and changemakers

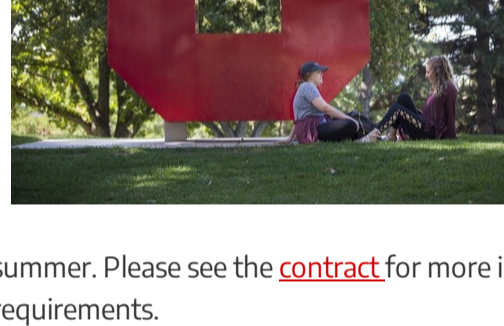

Amos Award for Distinguished Service to Women](#) recognizes individuals who have selflessly given time and energy to improve the educational and/or working environment for women at the university. Employee training on abusive conduct and firearms on campus

All employees will be re-enrolled in two compliance trainings. The first is about [abusive conduct](#). Utah law requires all employers within the Utah System of Higher Education to provide training to their employees regarding abusive conduct and the policy for resolving abusive conduct reports. The second training is about firearms on campus. The Firearms on Campus training, [first launched in 2019](#), has been refreshed and updated to provide guidance for reporting weapons or the possibility of a weapon on campus.

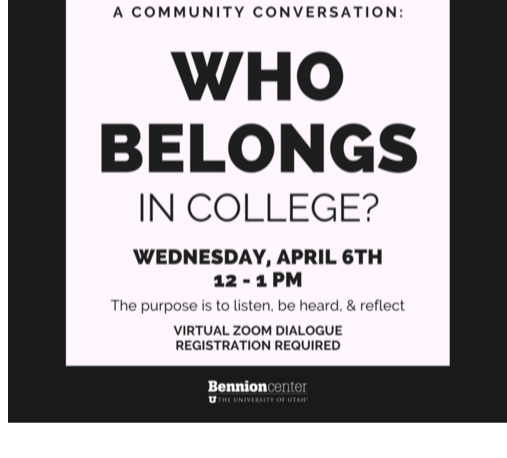
