LGBT Student Orientation

Brief description of program:

We asked several on and off campus departments and organizations join us in introducing the many resources available to LGBTQ and allied students at the University of Utah. The orientation lasted 2 hours with each presenter allotted 10-15 minutes apiece.

Who was asked to complete survey:

Predominantly new students, along with a few returning students, who attended one or both of our inaugural LGBTQ Student Orientations.

Respondents: 13 respondents of about 20 attendees

Administration Type: paper with web entry into StudentVoice

Summary of Key Findings:

People seemed to appreciate being introduced to several on and off campus organizations/resources. Many especially liked the panel of current students sharing their queer scholastic experiences. However, some mentioned that the 2 hours felt rushed, and that it was hard to schedule a 2 hour block in the middle of the day to attend the entire thing without having to leave early/come late.

Actions Taken:

We're looking at tweaking the schedule for next time to provide a better flow as well as better coordination with presenting departments.
