When asked about their future plans, students responded as follows:

62% plan to attend a 4 year college/university in Utah.

21% plan to attend a 4 year college/university out of state.

7% plan to attend a 2 year community college.

2% plan to pursue training at a technical school.

7% plan to take time off to work, then continue their education.

All respondents indicated they would apply for financial assistance if attending college.

74% reported they would apply for scholarships.

38% reported they would apply for some type of grant.

19% reported they would apply for Federal Student Loans.

16% of respondents indicated they did not know what type of financial assistance they would apply for.

52% of respondents reported they would be the first person in their family to attend college.

Only 31% of respondents reported taking the ACT or SAT prior to this event.

Most respondents (95%) reported having a major/field of study in mind.

79% reported feeling more confident about the college application process.

93% reported it was important to have a Black Student Union at the college they choose to attend, but only 88% indicated they would most likely join a Black Student Union.
