Counselor Conference 2011 Evaluation

Brief description of program:

High School Counselors from the state of Utah were invited to the University of Utah's campus for updates on Admission Requirements, Scholarships, and Financial Aid. A variety of breakout sessions were provided as well as lunch and a mingle with College representatives.

Who was asked to complete survey: All High School Counselor participants

Response Rate: 129 respondents of the 153 attendees

Administration Type: paper with data entry into Campus Labs

Summary of Key Findings:

- 74.42% of respondents strongly agreed that the conference provided them with relevant information with respect to their work with students.
- 78.57% of respondents strongly agreed that overall, this was a worthwhile event to attend.
- 36.29% of respondents strongly agreed that the structure of the college mingle was beneficial.
- Each of the presentations had several excellent ratings.

Actions Taken:

- Will look at holding the College Mingle in a different space.
- Will continue to hold different breakout sessions for the counselors to learn about different areas on campus.
