Honors U-Night Survey 2010-2011

Brief description of program: High school juniors and seniors attend a day and a half on campus in order to learn more about the U, tour campus and the resident halls, sit in on a classroom, learn about the Honors College, meet with an academic advisor and hear from a few services on campus. They stay overnight in the resident halls with a current Honors student and attend a current student event on campus.

Who was asked to complete survey: High school student participants and their parents/family members

Respondents: 29 high school students; 19 parents/family members

Administration Type: iTouches and paper

Summary of Key Findings:

- 100% of participants agreed or strongly agreed that the event was worthwhile to attend
- 22.92% indicated that the MOST helpful part of the visit was meeting with current students
- 100% of participants agreed or strongly agreed that they understood the importance of the Honors College
- 85.7% of student participants strongly agreed that their student host was friendly and courteous
- 67.67% are more likely to attend the U after their Honors U-Night visit

Actions Taken:

- Based on comments at the end of the survey we will do the following:
 - Enhance the evening activity such as have them attend a sporting event or select which evening activity they would like to attend prior to coming to the event

- Educate future undergraduate students about the opportunities available through higher education and at the University of Utah. Specific target groups include instate and out-of-state freshmen and transfer students, ethnically diverse students, underrepresented students, academically talented students, non-traditional students, and international students.
