Position Description:

- Be able to successfully pass a criminal background check required for entering the prison.
- Have a valid driver's license.
- Have reliable transportation to drive to the prison.
- Be able to be on-site at the prison at least three times per week.

Key Responsibilities:

- Coordinate and help facilitate weekly schedules at the prison.
- Serve as key contact for UPEP instructors and staff when problems arise; work collaboratively to address problems in real time.
- Serve as a representative of the UPEP program with the Utah Department of Corrections and on-site college programs.
- Other responsibilities as assigned by UPEP leadership team.

The ELP Graduate Research Assistant Can Expect to:

- Learn how to and practice effective communication across multiple stakeholders with different values.
- Apply theoretical and philosophical commitment to education.
